

I Am Somebody shares the stories 6 athletes and their journeys to the 2022 Street Child World Cup, which brought together 28 teams from 25 countries speaking 22 languages. Founded in 2010, the Street Child World Cup has become a global movement that uses the power of sport and arts to advocate for child rights. The 6 featured athletes are:



I Am Somebody has received over a dozen selections and awards, including the **Winner of the** *Guirlande d'Honneur* for **Best Football Documentary** at the 40th FICTS Sport Movies & TV International Film Festival in Milan. Recognized by the International Olympic Committee for its promotion of the values of sport through film, FICTS – Milan is the finals of a 20-film festival competition across 5 continents.

Some other considerations:

- **The majority of the film is subtitled.** That said, the film is visually compelling, having been shot in 5 different countries and made from over 400 hours of raw footage.
- **Content.** The film does not dwell on—but also does not shy away from—the reality of the lives of street-connected children. There is no narrator, so all content is captured live or is of people telling their stories. Content that might prove triggering
 - A brief scene of young people wielding guns
 - Three mentions in the subtitles of sexual violence; nothing visual is depicted
- Running Time. The film runs 97 minutes
- **Religion.** The Street Child World Cup movement is made up of individuals and organizations from a diversity of faiths and religion, and the film captures this diversity.
